INVITIATION TO PRESS TO TASTE NEW VARIETIES OF MANGO GRAPES ETC.

In year 2002, he had exhibited some very early and very late varieties, the dates of harvest and other characteristics are given below:

Mr. M.H. Panhwar and his wife Farzana have been experimenting with new varieties of mangoes to extend harvest season from 1st May to 31st October, a period of 6 months. The popular variety Sindhri is available from 20th of May to 20th June. Chausa is available to Sindh from 20th of June to 5th July. The Punjab mangoes are available from 1st July to 31st July. Except Sindhri and Chausa non is exportable. Indian mango season is April to 31st July Panhwars' have 3 varieties harvested from 1st to 31st May. They also have 6 varieties harvested from 1st July to 15th August. Of these are exportable having yellow or orange skin or yellow skin with red blush or total red.

They weigh 400-600 grams and ratio of seed to whole fruit is less than 10% i.e., seed is small, pulp is 75 to 80% of total weight. In taste they are much superior to local varieties "Sindhri" and "Chaunsa" and ripen in 10—15 days. They could be kept in refrigerator for 10-15 days. They are more juicy and sweeter, having good flavour and no oily smell. They do not have fibre. Two of them have shape like Sindhri and Chaunsa but are bigger but with red blush. The others are red or yellow, same size.

Presently they have no names but are called as under:
